to stay in compliance with the
NEW LAW SB1383...and help

STEP 1

A new California law went into effect **JANUARY 2022**.
Strict enforcement will begin soon... **JANUARY 2024**.

The law requires certain businesses to donate the maximum amount of their edible food that would otherwise be disposed—even food that hits its “sell by date”. This means that food that you don’t sell but is still edible must be donated to a recognized non-profit that has the experience and capacity to distribute or repurpose it.

The good news is that **Laborers of the Harvest** makes it easy to stay in compliance.

STEP 2

Contract with Laborers of the Harvest to come to your store and pick up edible food that can no longer be sold.

Laborers of the Harvest will pick up, weigh, document and report your contribution each time we pick up. We will sort, store, and distribute the food we collect to hungry families in the area.

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CALIFORNIA RETAIL FOOD CODE

CALIFORNIA HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE
PART 7. CALIFORNIA RETAIL FOOD CODE
Effective January 1, 2022



ARTICLE 7. FOOD FACILITY FOOD DONATIONS

114432. Any food facility may donate food to a food bank or to any other nonprofit charitable organization for distribution to persons free of charge.
114433. No food facility that donates food as permitted by Section 114432 shall be subject to civil or criminal liability or penalty for violations of any laws, regulations, or ordinances regulating the labeling or packaging of the donated product or, with respect to any other laws, regulations, or ordinances, for a violation occurring after the time of the donation.
